Student Senates both attended the meeting March 3, 2021

1. A student in the IT program area shared his experience that only US scholars and contributors seem to be what he is learning.

A student in Fluid Power shared he doesn't not see diversity both in ethnicity or women in his curriculum. He shared also there are very few to no females in his program. Last year 2019-2020 there was a first year female but she didn't return this year.

He came to HTC in the Health Sciences looking to transfer eventually to an optometry program or radiology. He got mixed guidance on which classes to take. He is now in the individualized studies program and taking classes at several MinnState schools.
